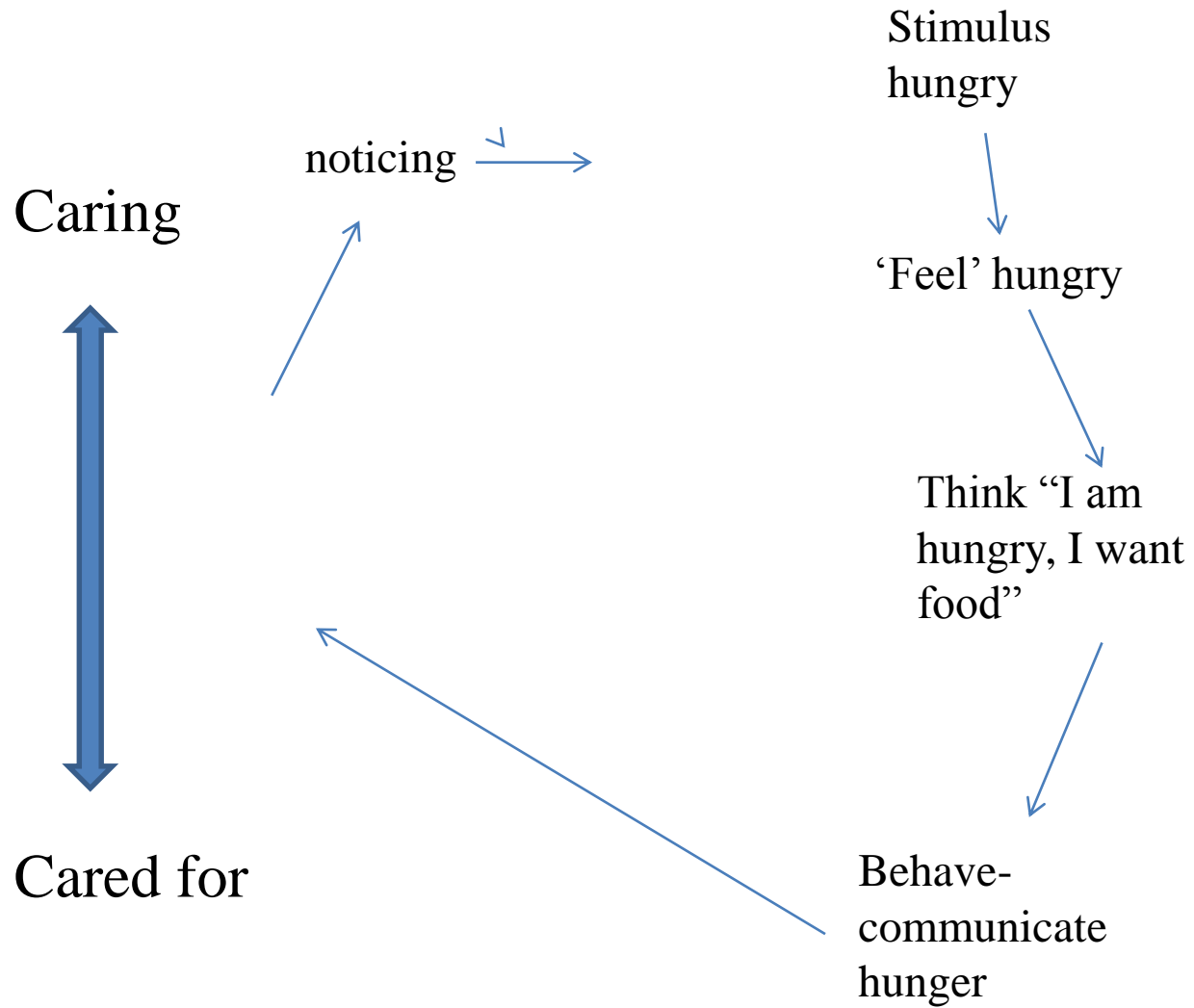

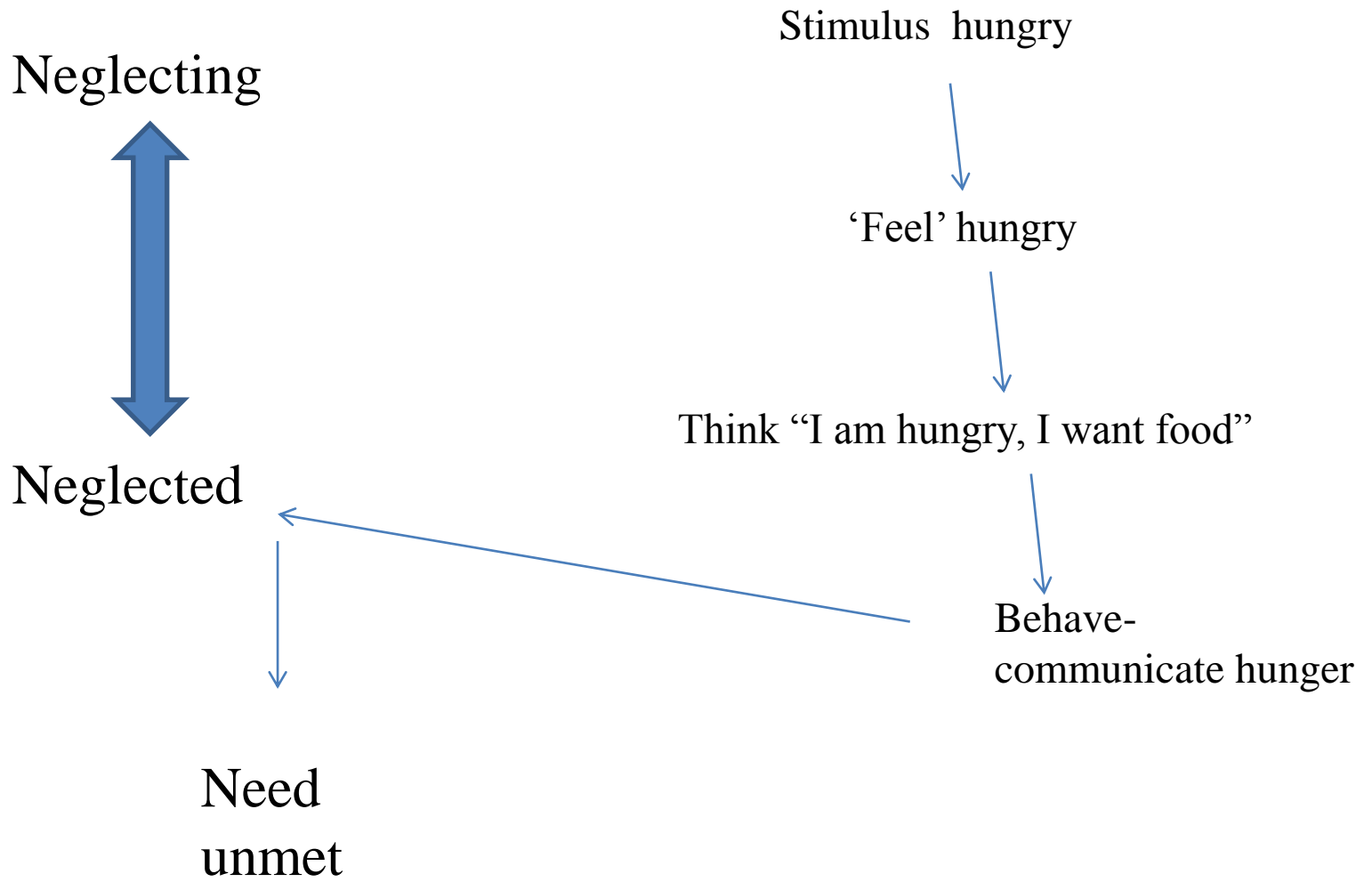
Organisations and Culture

Definition of 'Challenging Behaviour'

behaviour can be described as challenging when it is of such frequency and intensity, frequency or duration as to threaten the quality of life and/or the physical safety of the individual or others, and is likely to lead to **responses** that are restrictive, aversive or result in exclusion

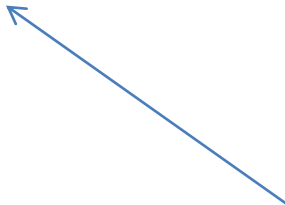
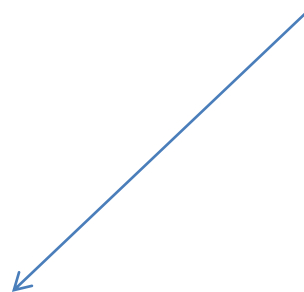
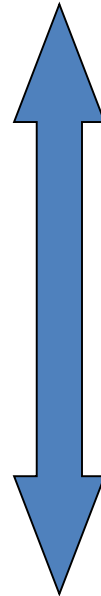
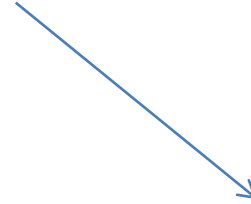
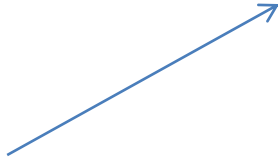

What is Positive Behavioural Support (PBS)?

PBS is an approach that blends values about the rights of people with disabilities with a practical science about how learning and behaviour change occur. The overriding goal of PBS is to enhance quality of life for individuals and their support providers

Horner (1999)

PBS and Values

- the regard that something is held to deserve; the importance, worth, or usefulness of something.
- principles or standards of behaviour; one's judgement of what is important in life.

Recent court case.

- "It was about giving them a better quality of life"
- ***"They had been in hospital or locked units. We wanted them to be free to be part of a community set up and be free to go to the shops or the pub."***

Eight charges of false imprisonment

- "organised and systematic abuse,"
- left in a room, known as either the "garden room" or the "quiet room"...often without food or water.
- "effectively imprisoned in that room against their will"
- "culture of care that was in effect abusive".
